• Children's Choir

The Children's Choir is open to any child ages Pre-School to 7th Grade. The participants sing unison and two part music and participate in the Sanctuary Services and the Contemporary Service 3-4 times per year. • Morning Glory Choir

• Joyful Noise Ringers

Monday 9:00-10:00 a.m. Handbell Room Director: Bob Marks

The Joyful Noise Ringers is our bell choir for adult beginners. If you have always wanted to ring handbells but have limited to no experience, this is the ensemble for you. This "low pressure" ensemble performs approximately four times per year in both sanctuary services, ringing music for three octaves at difficulty level two. We currently have openings in this choir. Wyckoff Orchestra
